HEAD OF SCHOOL LETTER

Dear MJDS Friends and Family,

As I reflect on our 40th year, I continue to be amazed and influenced by the growth, accomplishments and humanity of our students, staff and the MJDS community. We talk the talk about our core values of empathy, wonder and *tikkun olam* (repairing the world), then we walk the walk by leading and living them every day.

Empathy is learned through experience. This year, students from ethnically and culturally diverse partner schools in the **Repairing Together** program spent time online and in-person learning about each others' cultures, shared issues of social and environmental justice, and taking action together. Students from Indian Community School, Bruce Guadalupe Community School, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School and MJDS created works of art, explored the outdoors, talked about racism and participated in a "History Mystery" program. Guest artists and speakers shared their personal journeys and helped students vicariously experience the feelings and thoughts of others.

Wonder is experienced daily in our classrooms and beyond. MJDS faculty provide a safe, loving, personalized environment that motivates students to be curious, grow and ultimately engage successfully with the world as adults. Our graduates exemplify why families choose the Day School. MJDS had five of the 28 top students in Nicolet's most recent graduating class and seven members of the National Honor Society. At Homestead High School, 83% of MJDS alums were on the Honors or High Honors list. Former MJDS Lions heading to college in 2022 will be attending UW-Madison, University of Denver, Northwestern, Lawrence, McGill and Tufts, among many others.

Tikkun olam continues to be a focus for students. Events throughout the year included Michael Kovnar Memorial Mitzvah Day; a car wash and lemonade stand for Mackenzie Clyde Field Day; and a yearlong, student-led effort with each class identifying and fundraising for a charity, using a hallway bulletin board,

announcements and online communication to promote each charity (page 8).

Thank you to everyone who has supported us this past year with your time, talent, or treasure. Together we are equipping young people with the tools to make the world a better place, as empathetic and confident leaders.

DEAR MJDS STAFF, FAMILIES AND FRIENDS,

The drive to continually improve is encoded in the DNA of MJDS. From an early age, students learn to push through failure and use it as a learning opportunity rather than accept it as a final judgment. The MJDS staff models continual improvement in their relentless commitment to professional learning, striving to become even better teachers from one year to the next. And the MJDS Board of Directors adopts the very same mindset, understanding that the school's governing body must continually ask, and answer, hard questions to keep the school on course.

This year the MJDS Board explored how the school could best deliver on its mission in the coming years. The Living Our Mission Taskforce – comprised of board members, staff, community and parents – gathered for working sessions to debate and align goals in four key areas: continual improvement of our educational experience; optimal class and school size; whether to teach multiple languages at MJDS; and MJDS' role as a partner in the greater Jewish and Milwaukee communities.

Over the course of our four months of active discussions, this group and the Board developed a shared point of view around how to focus our efforts in the coming years. We decided to continue offering only Hebrew as a core component for all grades. We also determined that MJDS' current model of education, staff culture and operating processes are at their best with an enrollment of between 180 and 200 students. Finally, we are extremely proud of the impact of MJDS' partnerships with other community organizations,

including the JCC, Bruce Guadalupe Community School, Indian Community School, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School, Tikkun Ha-Ir and various social action organizations. MJDS will continue to invest in these partnerships and others that expand our students' understanding of the world while deepening their Jewish identities.

The end of the 2021-22 school year also marked the end of my tenure as Board President. I was delighted to pass the torch to Lina Dreyfus Wallace, who began serving as MJDS Board President on July 1, 2022. Lina is an engaging, thoughtful leader who brings perspective from multiple Midwestern Jewish Day Schools. I have no doubt that Lina, in partnership with Aaron Lippman, will energize and inspire MJDS' continual improvement in the years to come.

WHERE ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND JEWISH VALU

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Being an educator is a commitment to learning. In addition to providing quality, daily instruction to students, MJDS staff are continuously pursuing new growth opportunities. Some exciting initiatives include:



Faculty members are paired with a **Learning Partner**, a program established to support the ongoing professional growth of our teachers. The collaborative process encourages teachers to be reflective in their practice, while supporting student-owned learning. Together they work on unit and lesson planning, creation and implementation of student learning goals, curriculum development aligned to standards-based learning and more.



Civic Spirit is an organization that works with schools to enhance civic belonging and responsibility, helping young people become invested in the civic life of our democracy. This year, two faculty members began a year-long Educators Cohort that will enhance their knowledge and skills as civic educators, and introduce innovative approaches to these topics.



MJDS was selected to participate in **Teacher Institute for the Arts**. This initiative offers classroom teachers an opportunity to participate in specially designed educational classes that raise the quality of instruction through intensive training, mentoring and the implementation of sustainable, replicable, innovative curricula and programs.



TalentEducators, a global initiative that seeks to address the growing challenge of recruiting and retaining high-quality Jewish educators, paired a consultant with early childhood and lower school faculty to strengthen our Hebrew model.

Faculty studied the **Orton-Gillingham Approach**, a direct, structured approach that breaks reading and spelling down into smaller steps incorporating letters and sounds. Teaching connections provides a way to teach literacy to students challenged with more traditional approaches to reading, writing and spelling.



ES PREPARE CHILDREN FOR A LIFETIME OF SUCCESS,

JEWISH VALUES

The Jewish value of *pikuach nefesh* (preserving lives), supersedes almost all others. When the CDC announced COVID-19 vaccinations were available for children ages 5-11, MJDS was quick to act and hosted a vaccination clinic in our field house. One hundred of our early childhood and lower school students received their double dose and helped our community move one step closer towards ending the pandemic.

Repairing Together, a program of MJDS, started its fifth year connecting students from different cultural backgrounds in K-8 schools in the Milwaukee area through thematic cultural, social and environmental action programming. Partner schools currently include the Indian Community School, Bruce Guadalupe Community School, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School, and Milwaukee Jewish Day School. This year, early childhood students (JK and SK) spent time together in musical programs, cultural celebrations, holidays, and story times. First through third grade students shared field trips to community-based partners like the Urban Ecology Center and the Hunger Task Force Farm working on environmental projects together. Fourth and fifth grade students explored ideas about social justice, equity and repairing the world with guest teachers and an active arts unit. Finally, in upper school, students embarked on a three-year project to rewrite their own stories and histories, as they feel the stories should be told, and then take action together. The program is dynamic and designed to meet the needs of those involved, making feedback and suggestions from all participants an essential component of program evolution.

LIFETIME OF SUCCESS

Students who walk out the Star Door after graduating from MJDS will do great things in high school and beyond. This year, seven alums were in the National Honor Society at Nicolet High School, five of the 28 top students in Nicolet's most recent graduating class came from MJDS, and 83% of MJDS alums were on the Honors or High Honors list at Homestead High School.

Former MJDS Lions heading to college in 2022 will be attending UW-Madison, University of Denver, Northwestern, Lawrence, McGill and Tufts, among others.



Relationship-based education and small classes (there is a 6:1 student-to-staff ratio, with an average class size of 16 students) encourage students to take intellectual risks, collaborate with peers and solve problems creatively. Academic excellence and personal growth flourish in an atmosphere that is challenging and competitive, yet caring and nurturing.

LEADERSHIP AND ENGAGEMENT WITH THE WORLD.

LEADERSHIP

Genius Hour is an opportunity for students in seventh and eighth grades to design a meaningful learning experience around an idea, topic, question or theme they are interested in or passionate about. The goal of this annual program is to provide an opportunity for students to drive their own learning in an authentic way.

This year's projects were unique and diverse, including creation and coding of a video game, publishing a science magazine, programming a rising table, producing an original short film and more. Students were invested and engaged in their plans, learned beneficial teamwork strategies, and gained valuable planning and organizational skills.

These projects are made possible thanks to the Sandy Mitz Technology and Innovation Student Project Fund.

Engagement with the World

A ten-foot-long bulletin board in the halls of MJDS became a meaningful fundraiser throughout the school year. Each month a different grade took the lead and chose a cause they found meaningful, found a charity to support it, developed a decorative plan and the fundraising began!

Donations were collected to support Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, Trees for Israel, UNICEF, Midwest Athletes Against Childhood Cancer (MACC) Fund, refugees new to the Milwaukee area and the Jewish Community Food Pantry. Students also held a book drive for the pantry in an effort to provide families experiencing food insecurity with reading materials. Donations raised through the bulletin board initiative totaled over \$7,500 and 1,000 books.





ALUM JASON JESSE

Creating A Lasting Impact

Jason Jesse, MJDS Class of 2010, believes his years at the day school instilled the confidence and curiosity needed to attend medical school. "I was unorganized and struggled in middle school," he shared. "I needed to grow into becoming a good student. Being at MJDS was beneficial because of the small classes. I felt like every teacher knew who I was and was invested in how I was doing. When I was struggling academically, a teacher would take me aside, not to criticize or reprimand me, but to find out how they could help. At a bigger school I would have gotten lost."

The personal attention and family focus at MJDS helps students feel safe and develops their self-assurance. When a student is allowed to fail, then try again, it builds confidence in their decision making skills. These tools will be beneficial as Jason begins medical school this year, currently deciding between pursuing anesthesiology or surgery.

"MJDS helped me develop a passion for science. It wasn't just the content, but the way they taught. Adon [Brian] King is a perfect example of showing, as well as telling, what a difference it makes to live MJDS core values, in the way he talked about his family and took time to help me out. He was such a good person I wanted to listen to his lessons."

Staff review expectations with students daily, which includes the aforementioned core values of empathy, wonder and *tikkun olam*. This moral code becomes part of who they are and shapes the adults they become.

His favorite memory of MJDS is the weekly Shabbat Sing.

14 It was so spirited and fun. It taught me that religion can be a joyful celebration. Judaism promotes happiness and positivity."

"When I think of MJDS I realize I have never felt more connected to my teachers. It's surprising because I was so young, but those interactions were more meaningful to me than office hours with a college professor, having conversations on an adult level. My teachers at MJDS left a lasting impact on me and I think about them a lot."



CELEBRATING THE BRIGHT FUTURES GALA



After several pandemic-related delays, MJDS was thrilled to host the Bright Futures Gala in April 2022, celebrating our mission and raising critical funds to support integral programs. Long-time supporter and alumni parent Susan A. Lubar was presented with the 2022 Tikkun Olam Award for her deep commitment to our school, and to making an MJDS education accessible to more families.

During her acceptance, Susan explained why the school remains so important to her. "The best teachers are those who show you where to look and not what to see. I truly believe MJDS is so successful in guiding children to become responsible people that care and engage in our community. MJDS not only gave my children an outstanding education, but enveloped them in an environment of caring and love, while instilling a passion for learning and a connection to the greater community, both Jewish and general."

Guests in attendance enjoyed a lively auction, interviews with the student-led MJDS Schmooze News crew, creative displays throughout Saint Kate-the Arts Hotel and, best of all, the opportunity to gather together in celebration.

Many special people gave their time, talent and treasure to make the Bright Futures Gala a success, but a special thank you goes to committee cochairs, Jane and Stephen Chernof, and Jaynie Skadron and Howard Frankenthal. Through the generosity of our MJDS community, over \$275,000 was raised! The future does indeed look bright.

WHY WE GIVE

When it was time to enroll their oldest son Alex in K4, Louise and Jon Jesse toured MJDS. "The feeling that you get when you walk in the doors was not like something I'd ever experienced before," explained Louise. When they were done and in the parking lot, Louise asked Jon what he thought. He said, "Is there even a question? This school is about more than just providing a strong education. It will also incorporate the foundational values of being a good human being that we so strongly believe in."

She added, "We had a tour scheduled at another school but we canceled it!"

As she recalls the years Alex and Jason were students at MJDS, Louise often mentions the importance of character and wanting their sons to become good people.

"Our sons were very different from each other during their time at MJDS, but the teachers treated them as individuals. Some teachers taught both boys, yet always saw them for who they were," Louise said. "All students at MJDS have the opportunity to discover themselves and establish a strong sense of self. Jason is very bright,

but a weakness in organizational skills started impacting his academic results. Teachers helped him and us to address the issue in a manner that did not take away from his sense of self-worth."

Both of Louise's parents were scholars and lifelong learners. When her parents passed, Louise and Jon wanted to honor both of them in a way that would be long lasting - something that would be part not only of their legacy, but of Louise and Jon's, and someday, Alex and Jason's as well. When she asked her father what he considered most important, and he answered "Jewish education," the Jesses knew establishing an endowment at MJDS was the obvious choice. Established this year, the Drs. Edgar and Rachel Inselberg L'dor V'dor Fund supported by the Jesse Family will provide unrestricted support for MJDS, allowing the school to utilize the funds wherever they are most needed.






